1.	Name of Competition	8 th Amity National Hindi Moot Court Competition
2.	Host Institute	Amity Law School
3.	Brief Description of Competition	This Competition is conceived to promote & develop skills about the procedure followed in Moot court competitions and evaluate the knowledge of law students across the nation. It evaluates the law students both on the aspects of knowledge of law and facts. This is an effort of providing such a platform to law students so they can learn the basics of a Moot court which in turn opens a wider gate of one's overall learning experience. This competition was set up to promote and increase skills about the proceedings used by Trial Courts, as well as test the knowledge of law students across the country. It assesses law students' legal knowledge as well as their knowledge of facts. This is an initiative to provide such a platform for law students to understand the fundamentals of a Hindi Moot court, which in turn opens a broader doorway to one's comprehensive learning experience.

5.	Eligibility	5 year & 3year Law pursuing Graduates
6.	Rules	 Eligibility: Participants must be enrolled in a law school or equivalent program. Each team should consist of 3 members. Registration: Teams must register by the specified deadline, providing all required information and paying any applicable fees. Case Materials: The case problem will be provided to all teams at least four weeks prior to the competition. Teams must prepare both appellant and respondent briefs. Brief Submission: Written briefs must be submitted by the deadline. Late submissions may incur penalties or disqualification.



		• Oral Arguments : Each team will present oral arguments
		before a panel of judges. Time limits will be enforced (e.g.,
		15 minutes per side).
		• Judging Criteria: Judges will evaluate based on legal rea-
		soning, clarity, persuasiveness, and adherence to time lim-
		its.
		• Scoring: Each round will be scored, and the teams with the
		highest scores will advance to the next round.
		• Conduct : All participants must adhere to professional con-
		duct standards. Any form of misconduct may result in dis- qualification.
		• Amendments: The organizing committee reserves the right to amend these rules as necessary, with notice provided to
		all participants.
