

Celebration of Anti Ragging Day/Week (12th - 18th August 2023)

As per directions of University Grants Commission (UGC) regarding celebration of Anti Ragging Day/Week, Amity University Uttar Pradesh (AUUP) organized various events/activities at Institution and University Level from **12th to 18th August 2023** to commemorate **Anti Ragging Day / Week**.

To mark the occasion, Amity Business School organized a workshop on the topic **“Stop Ragging now and forever”** on Monday, the 14th August, 2023 from 3.15 pm to 5.00 p.m. at Room No.203, F-2 Block, Second Floor, Amity University Campus, Sector 125, Noida.

Objective of the workshop :

Dr. Sandeep Mathur, Professor ABS made a presentation to students emphasizing the need to combat the issue of ragging in educational institutions. The presentation included raising awareness about the negative impacts of ragging, educating students about relevant laws, promoting preventive measures, and encouraging open dialogue.

Dr. Jaya Yadav, Professor ABS prompted students to give opinions about the ragging in the campus. The students readily assured support in this campaign. In summary,

the interaction with students covered various topics, including understanding ragging, legal aspects, preventive strategies, reporting mechanisms, counseling, and support.

The outcomes included increased awareness, enhanced understanding of roles, improved campus safety measures, and the establishment of anti-ragging initiatives. The workshop concluded with a commitment to maintaining a respectful environment at Amity where each individual feels safe, valued and empowered.
