Abstract Submission Guidelines

1. Abstract Structure

Background:

Briefly introduce the research problem, context, and significance (2–3 sentences). Clearly highlight the research gap.

Objective:

State the main aim(s) of the study (1–2 sentences).

Methods:

Summarize the methodology, including study design, instruments, analytical techniques, or approaches used (3–4 sentences).

Results:

Present key findings with relevant data or observations (3–4 sentences).

Conclusion:

Provide the implications, significance, or potential applications of the findings (2–3 sentences).

2. Title and Author Information

Title:

Maximum 20 words
Bold and in Title Case

Authors:

List all authors with superscript affiliations
Clearly indicate the corresponding author with an asterisk (*)
Provide full affiliation details (Department, Institution, City, Country)

Corresponding Author Email:

Mandatory

3. Keywords

Include 3–6 relevant keywords
Use standard forensic and scientific terminology

4. Formatting Requirements

Word Limit: 250–300 words

Font: Times New Roman, 12 pt

Line Spacing: Single (1.15 preferred)

Alignment: Justified

Margins: 1 inch on all sides

5. Important Restrictions

Do not include:

References

Tables

Figures

Citations

Graphical Abstract Guidelines

A graphical abstract is mandatory

It should visually represent:

Workflow

Methodology

Key findings

Caption (Optional):

Provide a brief description in 1–2 sentences

Submission Notes

Ensure clarity, conciseness, and scientific accuracy

Use formal academic language

Avoid abbreviations unless commonly accepted
