

Dr Poshendra Satyal was born and raised in the foothills of Nepal Himalayas, and is now based in the UK. He currently works as Policy Coordinator at BirdLife International (world's largest conservation organisation) in Cambridge. He is also a Trustee/Director of the Royal Geographical Society's Mount Everest Foundation, and an Affiliate Fellow of the University of East Anglia (UEA)'s Global Environmental Justice Group and Southasia Institute of Advanced Studies (Nepal).

With a background in the natural and social sciences, Poshendra has experience in interdisciplinary research, teaching, consultancy and project management, particularly in the environment and development sector. Prior to his current role at BirdLife, Poshendra worked as a senior researcher at the UEA's School of International Development and a research fellow at the Crichton Carbon Centre and ClimateXChange - Scotland's Centre of Expertise on Climate Change. In the past, he also worked as a researcher and consultant with a number of organizations in the UK (Warwick University, The Open University, Anglia Ruskin University, UNEP - World Conservation Monitoring Centre, Fern, and Forests Monitor) and Nepal (Himalayan College of Agricultural Sciences and Technology, Forum for Sustainable Development Nepal, and Institute for Sustainable Agriculture Nepal).

Poshendra received his PhD from the Geography Department of The Open University, UK (2005-2009) and an MPhil in Environment and Development from the University of Cambridge, UK (2001-2002). Before coming to the UK, he had obtained a BSc (Honours) in Agriculture from Haryana Agricultural University (1996-2000) and a BSc from Tribhuvan University, Nepal (1994-1996).
