

BIO FOR RONALD L. SINGER

Ronald Singer, M.S. has been a criminalist for over forty-nine years. After over sixteen years with the Jefferson Parish (Louisiana) Sheriff's Office Crime Laboratory as Crime Laboratory Director and a Criminalist specializing in firearms/toolmarks, trace evidence, blood spatter and crime scene reconstruction, he moved to Fort Worth, Texas where he established the Tarrant County Medical Examiner's Criminalistics Laboratory, a full service ASCLD/LAB accredited laboratory. In 2009, Mr. Singer was promoted to the position of Technical & Administrative Director of the Medical Examiner's Office. Since his retirement in 2019, Mr. Singer has maintained a private practice as a consulting forensic scientist specializing in firearms/toolmarks/impression evidence, blood spatter and crime scene reconstruction. He has served on the faculties of Loyola University of New Orleans, Texas Christian University, University of North Texas, Weatherford College and Tarrant County College. He has testified as an expert in Federal, State and Local Courts throughout the United States and has been an invited lecturer in Dubai, England, Hungary, Bosnia, the Maldives, Sri Lanka, Turkey, the Czech Republic and Portugal.

Mr. Singer is a Distinguished Fellow and Past President of the American Academy of Forensic Sciences, a Past President of the International Association of Forensic Sciences, a Distinguished Member and Past President of the Association of Firearm and Tool Mark Examiners, an Emeritus Member and Past Secretary of the American Society of Crime Laboratory Directors, and a member of numerous other forensic associations. He is the recipient of the American Academy of Forensic Sciences Criminalistics Section Distinguished Service Award, the Mediterranean Academy of Forensic Sciences Gold Medal Award and the Association of Firearm and Tool Mark Examiners Member of the Year Award.
