CONCEPT NOTE

The 21st century has seen a major shift in global power, with Asia emerging as a key player in international affairs. A central aspect of this transformation is the deepening Asia-Americas relationship, driven by economic, political, and cultural exchanges. Once a dividing line, the Pacific Ocean now serves as a vital conduit for trade, investment, and diplomacy.

Historically, global influence had centered around the Atlantic, dominated by Europe and North America. However, the rapid rise of China, India, and other Asian economies has repositioned the Americas as a crucial partner for markets, resources, and strategic cooperation. Beyond economics, Asia's growing political influence is evident in expanding diplomatic and security engagements across the region.



Migration and cultural exchange further strengthen these ties. Asian diaspora communities in the Americas have shaped local societies, while cultural exports like K-pop, Bollywood films, manga, and anime continue to gain global popularity. Understanding this evolving relationship requires a multidimensional approach, considering economic interdependence, strategic competition, technological advancements, and social transformation. The conference aims to examine the key drivers, impacts, and challenges of Asia's expanding role in the Americas, offering a nuanced perspective on the shifting global order and fostering a deeper discussion on its future trajectory. The conference also focuses on a workshop based on sustainable practices focused on SDG 4 and SDG 12.

Jawaharlal Nehru University (JNU)

is the foremost university in India, and a world-renowned centre for teaching and research. Ranked number one in India by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) with a Grade Point of 3.91 (on a scale of 4), JNU was ranked no 3 among all universities in India by the National Institutional Ranking Framework, Government of India, in 2016 and no 2 in 2017. JNU also received the Best University Award from the President of India in 2017. Several academic Centres of the university have been declared by the University Grants Commission (UGC) to be 'Centres of Excellence'.



The Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU)

established by an Act of Parliament in 1985, has continuously striven to build an inclusive knowledge society through inclusive education. It has tried to increase the Gross Enrollment Ratio (GER) by offering high-quality teaching through the Open and Distance Learning (ODL) mode. Today, it serves the educational aspirations of over 3 million students in India and other countries through 21 Schools of Studies and a network of 67 Regional Centres, around 2,000 Learner Support Centres and 20 overseas institutions. The University offers about 200 certificate, diploma, degree and doctoral programmes, with a strength of nearly 250 faculty members and 230 academic staff at the headquarters and regional centres and over 35,000 academic counsellors from conventional institutions of learning, professional organisations, and industry among others.



The University of Delhi (DU)

is a premier university of the country with a venerable legacy and international acclaim for highest academic standards, diverse educational programmes, distinguished faculty, illustrious alumni, varied co-curricular activities and modern infrastructure. Over the many years of its existence, the University has sustained the highest global standards and best practices in higher education. The President of India is the Visitor, the Vice-President is the Chancellor, and the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of India is the Pro-Chancellor of the University.



Indian Council of World Affairs (ICWA)

The Indian Council of World Affairs was established in 1943 by a group of Indian intellectuals as a think tank. It was registered as a non-official, non-political and non-profit organisation under the Registration of Societies Act 1860. By an Act of Parliament in 2001, the Indian Council of World Affairs has been declared an institution of national importance. The Vice President of India is the ex-officio President of ICWA. It is devoted exclusively for the study of international relations and foreign affairs. Historic international conferences like 'Asian Relations Conference' in 1947 under the leadership of freedom fighter Sarojini Naidu and 'United Nations and the New World Order' in 1994 have been held by this think tank in which world renowned dignitaries addressed huge gatherings of intellectuals. Scores of conferences, meetings and panel discussions have been organised by the Council in its elegant building called "Sapru House".



Shastri Indo-Canadian Institute (SICI)

The Shastri Indo-Canadian Institute (SICI) is a unique bi-national organization, mandated by governments of India and Canada to promote, facilitate and nurture academic linkages, collaborations & exchanges, research partnerships, and networks on bi-national corridors. With its physical presence in New Delhi, India and Calgary, Canada, and a strong base of 156 Indian and 36 Canadian member institutions, for past 55 years, SICI is the only organization in the Canada-India higher education corridor that is instrumental in building and strengthening intellectual and cultural relationship through research and dialogue. Funded by the Ministry of Education, Government of India, it supports diverse disciplines including Social Sciences, Humanities, Science & Technology, Biotechnology, Agriculture, Arts, Literature, Culture, Law, Business, Economic Reform, etc. and covers all levels of higher education from undergraduate to postdoc and from faculty to collaborative research
