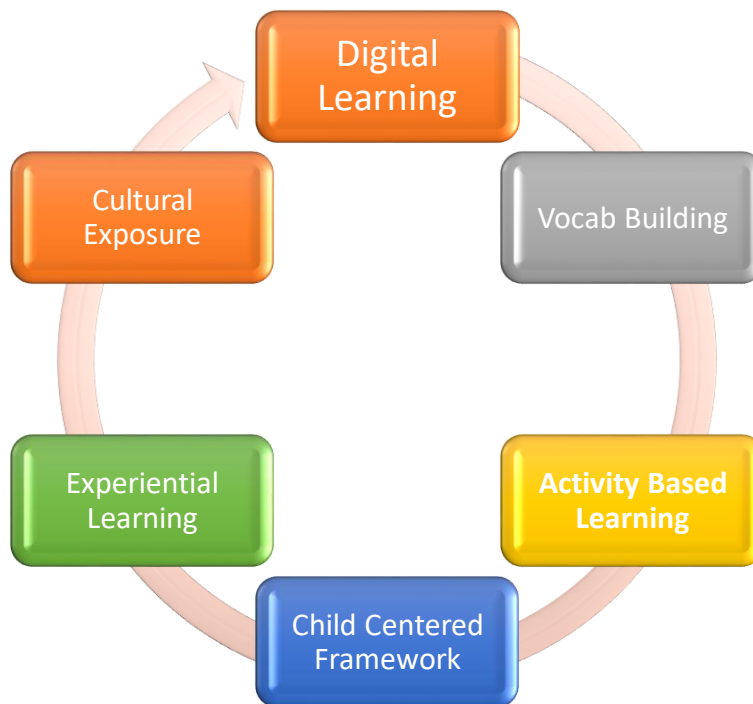


Curriculum

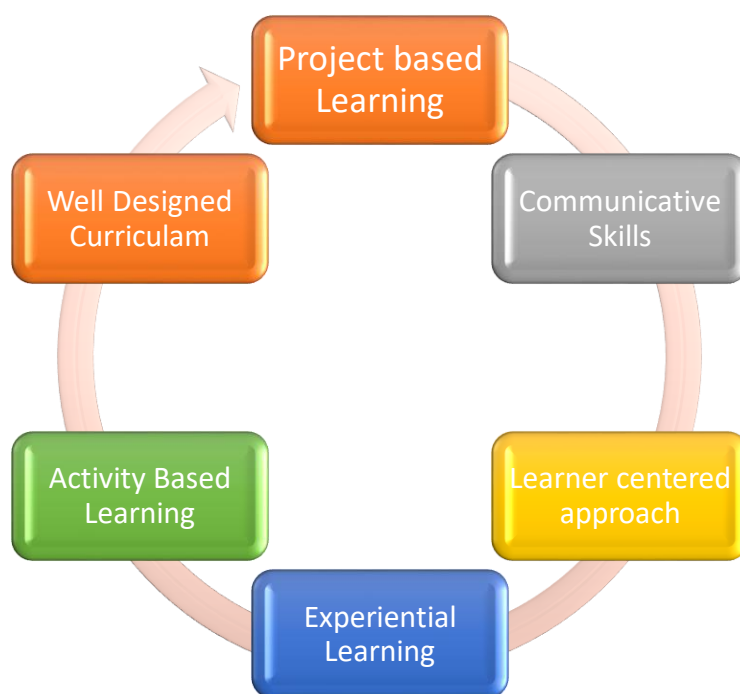
Primary Level

Middle Level
