
Value Added Course with title "Skill Development for Career Progression in Fashion Industry" was organized by ASFT from 13th- 17th May'24 in Online Mode

The course commenced on 13th May'24 with a welcome note by Prof. (Dr.) Smita Bagai, Professor ASFT & Program Coordinator






The last session of Day 3 was" Significance of Communication in Creative Industry " by Mr shankar sahay, Head CRC ASFT.






