1.	Name of Competition	Lex Generalis
2.	Host Institute	Amity law School, Noida
3.	Brief Description of the Competition	Amity Law School, Amity University, Noida, Uttar Pradesh is excited to present its 2 nd National Legal Quiz Competition, 'Lex Generalis' (law of general application), which is designed to offer undergraduate (UG) law students across India an exceptional platform to assess and expand their legal knowledge and comprehension. The offline National Quiz Competition scheduled to be held on 29 th February 2024 in I Block, Amity Law School, Amity University, Noida, Uttar Pradesh is to expected to encourage UG students of law to engage in quizzing activities to foster their understanding of laws of general application. The competition also intends to provide a platform to the UG students of law to come together to test their knowledge of the changing laws, regulations, mores, etc. Further, 'Lex Generalis' attempts to offer an opportunity to the students to hone their time management skills that all budding lawyers and other legal professionals are supposed to possess.

5.	Eligibility	Undergraduate students studying law anywhere in India
6.	Rules	<p>1. Eligibility:</p> <p>A. Only individual participation is allowed.</p> <p>B. Bonafide Law Students of Undergraduate Courses from Universities/Colleges/Institutions across the country may participate in the National Quiz Competition.</p> <p>C. LLM students, research scholars doing MPHIL or PHD will not be permitted to participate in the quiz competition.</p> <p>2. Registration:</p> <p>A. Registration of individual participants will start from 01.02.2024 and will end on 21.02.2024., 11.59 pm.</p> <p>B. Registration will be on a 'first-come-first-served' basis. Students from Amity Law School,</p>

		<p>Noida may also participate in the National Quiz Competition. However, the Organizing team may cap the number of such participants.</p> <p>C. The first 100 participants will be allowed to participate in the National Quiz Competition. However, the Organizing team shall have the discretion to increase or reduce the number of participants, in case of any exigency/supervening impossibility or otherwise.</p> <p>D. Outstation candidates may register for the event. However, they need to meet their own staying and travelling expenses.</p> <p>3. Format of the Quiz Competition:</p> <p>A. There will be three rounds, viz., the Qualifying Round comprising 100 questions (that have to be answered in one hour), the Second Round and the Final Round.</p> <p>B. The Qualifying Round will be based on Multiple Choice Questions (MCQs), each question carrying one mark. The performance of the participants in the qualifying rounds of the National Quiz Competition will be evaluated based on “Maximum Correct Answers” in one hour time.</p> <p>D. The first 16 participants who have the Maximum Correct Answers shall qualify for the Second Round of the National Quiz Competition. In the Second Round, the 16 participants will be divided into two groups (Groups A and B) and the best four performers in each group shall qualify for the Final Round. The Second Round shall consist of three quizzing sub-rounds.</p> <p>E. The Final Round, which shall consist of five quizzing sub-rounds, will have eight participants.</p> <p>4. Quizzing Rules and regulations:</p> <p>A. The mode of conduct of the National Quiz Competition will be offline.</p> <p>B. The medium of the quiz will be English only.</p> <p>C. The National Quiz Competition organizers reserve the right to amend or repeal any rule or eligibility criteria at any time before the commencement of the competition.</p> <p>B. The participants must fill the registration form carefully. The information fed should exactly be the same as required by them on their Certificates.</p> <p>C. The Minute-to-Minute of the National Quiz Competition will be emailed to the participants in due course of time.</p>
