



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

KNOWING INDIAN CULTURE THROUGH SANSKRIT Report

Under the evening school project, a ten-day workshop was organized by the Amity Centre for Sanskrit and Indic Studies, Amity University, Haryana. Several eminent scholars shared their enlightening views on various sub-topics based on "Sanskrit to Culture" (संस्कृत से संस्कृति की ओर)

The inaugural session of the workshop was graced by the presence of esteemed individuals such as Honourable Vice Chancellor of Amity University, Prof. PB Sharma, Prof. Shashi Tiwari, Dr. Baldevanand Sagar, Yoga Guru Ram Avtar, Dr. Pankaj Mishra, Dr. Ashutosh Angiras, and Prof. Sanjay Kumar Jha. During this session, every speaker emphasized the immense significance of Sanskrit and its inseparable connection with culture. They were unanimous in their opinion that a proper understanding of culture is incomplete without a deep knowledge of Sanskrit.

The workshop served as a platform for diverse discussions and insights into the profound influence of Sanskrit on various aspects of culture. Scholars from different backgrounds and expertise shared their wisdom, enriching the participants' understanding of this ancient language and its role in shaping cultural values and traditions.

Throughout the ten days, participants engaged in fruitful interactions, exploring how Sanskrit serves as a key to unlocking the treasures of our heritage and preserving our ancient wisdom. The workshop undoubtedly left a lasting impact on all those involved, fostering a deeper appreciation for Sanskrit and its irreplaceable role in preserving and promoting our cultural legacy

On the first day of the workshop, Prof. Ashutosh Angiras from Sanatan Dharma College, Ambala, delivered a comprehensive discourse on the subject "Sanskrit - Subject, Challenges, and Solutions" in his session. He expressed concern about the present position of the Sanskrit subject and the challenges before us, emphasizing the need to bring changes in Sanskrit education and teaching methods so that Sanskrit can reach the masses effectively.

Mr. Narendra ji, prabhari of the North Zone of Sanskrit Bharti, joined the workshop on the second day and stated that the coming era is the golden age for Indians due to the presence of Sanskrit. However, he emphasized the need to embrace the ancient culture, as taught by our forefathers, through concepts like " सर्वेभवन्त्स्खिनः, " and " वस्दैवक्दंबक्म " to realize this golden age.

Dr. Pankaj Kumar Mishra, Associate Professor St. Stephen's College Delhi University, delivered his discourse on the third day, focusing on the interconnection between Sanskrit literature and culture. He emphasized how literature shapes our culture and our thoughts, acting as a reflection of our emotions.

On the fourth day, Yoga Guru Dr. Ram Avtar Ji from Ekal Yoga Ayog, gave his address on the importance of Sanskaras. In 16 samskaras, he specially emphasized on the importance of marriage and pregnancy samskaras and told that these two samskaras are mainly necessary samskaras, therefore it is very important to have these two samskaras duly performed for the promotion of Indian culture.

Dr. Baldevanand Sagar National president of World Sanskrit Media Council was present among us as a speaker on the fifth day. He said in his address that Indian culture is the most ancient culture of the world and only by understanding this culture we can understand other cultures of the world. While brainstorming on this topic from Sanskrit to culture, Dr. Sagar discussed many topics related to Sanskrit and culture. During his discussion on Sanskrit and culture, he referred to Sanskrit literature as a science.

On the sixth day, as the main speaker, Dr. Prasoon Kumar Mishra from Delhi University presented his discourse on Vedic literature and spirituality. He shared profound insights on the subject.

On the seventh day, two speakers presented their addresses. Firstly, Dr. Ayush Gupta from Sagar University spoke on Indian knowledge tradition, drawing from Vedic literature and science. Secondly, Prof. Shashi Tiwari, President of Waves India, shared important facts reflecting Indian culture and elaborated on the central topic of Sanskrit to culture.

On the eighth day of the workshop, two speakers, Dr. Dilip and Dr. Rupesh, working as assistant professors in Delhi University, presented their addresses and they informed all the participants about very informative facts by making Sanskrit and culture the centrepiece.

Brief Overview:



ABOUT THE THEME

Half a century ago, Higher Education was seen as an elite privilege, reserved for the wealthy, ambitious, and upwardly mobile. There were fewer than 30 million people enrolled in Higher Education in 1970. Since then, the size of the world's student body has, it is fair to say, grown significantly. By 2025, experts estimate that the number of students in Higher Education worldwide will have risen to 262 million.

In the recent years, the question of collaboration and cooperation between Higher Education and Industry has become a highly topical issue, transcending expectations. The broadening of Higher Education has led to better access to tertiary learning and professional opportunities for a larger percentage of the population, however, the consequences of this growth are under-examined. The explosion of student demand for Higher Education means that the competition on all sides of the University-Student Ecosystem has increased many folds. What is more, students now have career options that are remarkably far from the potential pathways they might have followed 20 or even 10 years ago.

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While it is easy to dismiss the career worries of students as typical of early-20s malaise, how these worries align with the Industry needs should be a concern for all. Skills demand is changing fast; a popular report by World Economic Forum estimated that 65% of children entering Primary School 10 years ago will end up employed in jobs that do not exist yet, which means that we currently only understand 35% of the future Industry needs. Further, students are being trained for careers that don't take into account the development of newer jobs and skill sets. According to various Reports, even now, 40% of Firms across the world cannot fully staff their businesses; the people with the right combination of skills and experience simply aren't there.

It thus needs to be considered that if students need to prepare to enter a workforce that we don't yet fully understand, how can universities get a better grasp on the future? Well, everyone involved in Higher Education should be devoting a significant amount of time to thinking, deliberating, and discussing about how industries are changing, from increasing reliance on freelancers, to developing technologies for better flexible working. Bringing an educational perspective to these changes will benefit not only Universities and students, but also positively affect the global economy, by reducing the skills gap and better meeting the needs of the Industry.

Keeping all this in view, Amity Law School, Amity University Haryana organised a 5-Day Faculty Development Program (FDP) on "Changing Dimensions of The Industry and Revisiting Andragogical Approaches in Higher Education: Present Needs and Way Forward," from 24 to 28 July 2023, in Virtual Mode.

The focal objective of this FDP was to afford a forum where Industry and Academia discuss the changing dynamics of the Industry and how Academia can help in reducing the skill gaps that have emerged. of the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor. He said that the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor has expressed his appreciation for the theme of the FDP and feels that

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
the FDP would be beneficial for all participants in the designing of their teaching methodologies.


Sundram, General Counsel - Sr. VP (Legal) and Chief Compliance Officer for NEC Corporation India and all the other Participants.

Prof. Sundram explained that to manage all this, the first requirement is that Faculty Members must understand the needs of the Industry so as to align their Teaching Learning Process to produce Industry-ready professionals. He mentioned how Faculty Members and current curricula need to adapt to changes and discussed the need of revising the whole curriculum at the end of the academic Session and dedicating a separate Elective for new developments in Law, both nationally and internationally. He mentioned that Colleges need to add more value to practical training along with the traditional conceptual teaching approaches, and there should be more collaborative methods that should be introduced in Higher Education.


Development in leading forums such as CII and Mr. Ramaswamy was appreciative of the taken by Amity Law organising a Session on Page | 9

Dr Atul Jain, Associate Professor, Amity Law School began the Session by welcoming Ms. Ojasvita and elaborating on the theme for the day.



Ms. Ojasvita Srivastava is a graduate of V. M. Salgaocar College of Law, Goa, and LLM in Commercial and Corporate Law from Queen Mary, University of London. She is currently the General Counsel for Securitas Africa, Middle East & Asia Division, and founder of Project Abhimanyu. Prior to this Ms. Ojasvita, worked at a multinational French Pharma Company in Mumbai and later practiced at the Supreme Court, Delhi High Court and three

District Courts at Delhi. As the General Counsel, Ms. Ojasvita overlooks Legal Management, Contracts, Compliance, Corporate Governance and Values and Ethics aspects for the region Africa, Middle East and the Asia Pacific.

Ms. Ojasvita began her Session by explaining what Artificial Intelligence (AI) is, its application in the field of Law and its impact on Higher Education. She posed a couple of questions to the Participants like did they believe AI would take away their jobs or replace them as teachers? She apprised the Participants as to how AI was being used globally and how E-discovery has become mandatory in the



United States of America. She gave examples of various applications that have been developed in India and are very useful, like ChatGPT, Wepik, Yippity, Gradespace, Capitol Education, Teachmate.ai and Supace (used by Supreme Court if India).

Ms. Ojasvita further explained that AI has certainly increased efficiency but there is a risk of over-dependence. Further, there are certain Legal and ethical challenges still to overcome. She emphasized that privacy and protection of personal data remains at risk. She discussed the need of co-opting AI in Higher Education and how it has the potential to personalize education and create more efficient learning environments. She elaborated that while AI would not replace teachers, classroom revolution was inevitable.



Ms. Ojasvita concluded by saying that we need to be future ready- have the right attitude, upskill and adopt the use of AI for our students. As Teachers we must design our lesson plans thinking, critical and creative. Further as Teachers we must discuss the

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positive and negative impacts AI is having in the society.

Students gained knowledge of the different techniques of Textile testing required for Quality checks of fabric in the industry.

They learnt how to measure GSM, yarn Count, pilling resistance and tensile strength of fabric and also learnt how to check colorfastness, color variation and snap pull strength etc.

They performed some basic textile testing using instruments like the GSM cutter, EPI, PPI, Rubbing fastness, Color matching, Snap pull tester, Tensile strength tester and Beasley balance.

Students learnt the importance of the Safety measures required to be taken in the Industry during Textile testing.

Overview:

In business, contracts are extremely important and often play a central role in its success. When it comes to contract design, there are a lot of things to consider, such as making sure contracts serve everyone's best interests and figuring out how to help prevent future contractual litigation. Whether it is a contract for builders, construction management contracts, a real estate contracts, or any other contract, its essential for them to draft effective commercial contracts.

In order to highlight and elaborate more on the importance of contract drafting and to provide valuable insights on how to improve the contract drafting skills of law students, Amity Law School, Amity University Haryana had organised a Hybrid guest lecture titled "CONTRACT DRAFTING: BEST PRACTICES" on Friday 15th March 2024. There were 69 attendees physically present in the Moot Court and about 87 attendees joined through Microsoft Teams. Ms. Noor Chabra, a student of BALLB[H] 4th semester, welcomed the guest lecturer, Dr. Astha Mehta, Head of Department, School of Law, Sushant University, Gurugram.

The lecture commenced with Dr. Astha talking about how drafting a contract is a very personal and human thing to do and hence Artificial Intelligence like ChatGPT will not be able to replace a real human drafting a contract as AI will not give the human touch to it. Dr. Astha continued by talking about the importance of legal research for the drafting of contracts and further highlighted the importance of the use of appropriate legal terminology while drafting the contracts.

Further, Dr. Astha elaborated on having a better understating of commercial laws and how it helps to draft a better contract that results in minimal chances of arising of disputes. Dr. Astha, through her presentation, explained all the important clauses of a contract to bear in mind while drafting the contract so as to avoid any possible contractual litigations.

Dr. Astha, moving further, provided valuable insights about the necessary legal knowledge required to draft an effective contract. She also explained about the client demands and solving the problems through analysis of the contract. Later, she elaborated on the importance of interpreting the laws and having an eye for details. She also provided the students with templates and formats to draft an effective contract that avoids any major legal hurdles and obstacles.

Concluding the lecture, Dr. Astha opened the lecture for questions and clarifications from the students. Ms. Shayla Goel of BALLB[H] 4th semester asked a question about how artificial intelligent consulting can reshape legal processes. She answered by saying that optimal use of Artificial Intelligence can definitely yield productive results. However, solely relying on Artificial Intelligence is not advised as it still lacks the finesse

that comes when a person drafts a contract. Another question was asked by Ms. K 4^{th} semester. She asked about the importance of dispute resolution in a contract. Dr

dispute resolution in a contract can be done through various methods like compensation. However, it is ideal if the contract has minimal chances of arising of disputes.


