SDG 17: Year 2022-23





SDG 1

Amity University Haryana is commitment to eradicating poverty, supporting the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals, and promoting socioeconomic growth. Key initiatives include:

- Inclusive Education: The university provides need-based admissions and scholarships, with a merit-cum-need a d mission policy aimed at socioeconomically disadvantaged students. For example, 8% of the 2022-23 student body came from marginalized groups.
- 2. Financial Support: AUH facilitates education loans, collaborates with banks for concessional loan rates, and provides installment options for fee payments.
- 3. Practical Learning and Employment: Students engage in internships and paid projects to gain industry experience. The Corporate Resource Centre supports near-100% placement rates, with 54,000 students placed in 2022-23.
- 4. Entrepreneurship and Skill Development: Through the Amity Innovation Incubator, students receive mentorship, financial aid, and business resources, fostering entrepreneurial skills and job creation. The university's role as a training partner under PM YUVA Yojana aims to train 2,500 entrepreneurs over five years.
- 5. Community Outreach: AUH organizes medical camps and conducts socioeconomic surveys in nearby villages to identify and meet community needs in health, nutrition, and renewable energy.



SDG 2

Amity University Haryana (AUH) supports the United Nations Sustainable Development Goal 2 (SDG 2), which focuses on eradicating hunger and ensuring food security. Key initiatives include:

- 1. Education and Outreach: AUH offers degree programs in Dietetics, Nutrition, and Hospitality to educate students and the community on healthy eating. The university also hosts workshops, webinars, and community outreach on nutrition, with an emphasis on practical applications.
- 2. Research and Innovation: Faculty and students at AUH engage in research on nutrition, food security, and sustainable agriculture. Several publications, book chapters, and patents highlight their contributions, addressing issues such as nutrition, food fortification, and sustainable agricultural practices.
- 3. Healthy Food Choices: AUH maintains food quality and safety on campus, offering affordable, nutritious meals across eight food service points. These facilities adhere to high standards of hygiene and provide diverse dietary options.
- 4. Sustainable Agriculture: AUH's campus farms produce organic vegetables and dairy, with a focus on eco-friendly practices. The dairy farm supplies fresh milk, while biogas from cow dung powers campus facilities, demonstrating the university's commitment to renewable energy.

5. Community Engagement: AUH reduces food waste by donating excess food to underserved communities and partners with the Robin Hood Army to address local food insecurity. Faculty members also provide nutrition education and guidance on combating malnutrition in nearby communities.

These efforts reflect AUH's commitment to promoting food security, health, and sustainable practices, advancing the global goal of Zero Hunger.





SDG 3

- 1. Research & Innovation Infrastructure: AUH has over 100 high-tech labs, interdisciplinary research clusters, and centers of excellence in areas like lipidomics, materials science, and cheminnova, which support national and global research collaborations.
- 2. Patent and Publication Output: The university filed 175 patents and received grants totaling 21.7 crores for 54 research projects. Faculty and students published 4,900 research papers and contributed over 200 book chapters.
- 3. Entrepreneurship Ecosystem: AUH's Innovation Incubator and Entrepreneurship Cell support student startups through mentorship, financial advice, and workshops. The Rural Innovation Incubator works on sustainable rural solutions, such as solar technology in villages, with positive community feedback.
- 4. Skill Development and Industry Partnerships: The university collaborates with the National Skill Development Corporation and offers skill-based courses and entrepreneurship training, targeting 2,500 entrepreneurs in five years. Numerous MoUs with industry and academia strengthen its research and entrepreneurial ecosystem.
- 5. Events and Community Engagement: AUH organized over 40 events, including seminars, workshops, and industry visits, to promote innovation and support budding entrepreneurs.

SDG 11

Aligned with SDG 11, AUH is committed to creating sustainable, inclusive, and resilient communities. The university's LEED Platinum-certified campus is designed with environmental sustainability at the forefront, incorporating green spaces, sustainable transport, and accessible infrastructure.

Key Initiatives:

- Sustainable Infrastructure: AUH's LEED Platinum certification attests to its green building practices, including energy and water conservation. The campus features eco-friendly spaces, promoting accessibility for women, children, and persons with disabilities.
- 2. Sustainable Transport: The university offers affordable and accessible transport, including public transport options, a fleet of low-emission vehicles, and bicycle-friendly infrastructure.
- 3. Green Spaces & Heritage: AUH maintains organic farms, herbal gardens, and biodiversity-friendly zones supporting local flora and fauna. The university promotes cultural heritage through arts, yoga, and Indic studies programs, integrating Indian cultural values into the curriculum.
- 4. Research & Education on Sustainability: AUH conducts research on sustainable urban planning and renewable energy. Students are involved in community outreach, research, and projects focusing on sustainable development, such as crime prevention, green infrastructure, and waste management.
- 5. **Community Engagement:** Student clubs and university programs promote environmental awareness and sustainability. The campus supports housing for employees, creche facilities, and local community access to facilities.

- 1. Education on Sustainability: AUH integrates SDG-aligned programs, offering courses in sustainable management, renewable energy, environmental sciences, and climate science. Specialized electives, like climate science and disaster management, prepare students for addressing global sustainability challenges.
- 2. Waste Management: The university has a comprehensive waste management system, categorizing waste into solid, liquid, and electronic types. It partners with certified vendors to manage and recycle waste, including biogas production and composting systems for organic waste.
- 3. Water Conservation: AUH operates effluent and sewage treatment plants to recycle wastewater for horticulture and other uses, promoting groundwater replenishment. Wastewater from cafeterias and labs is treated separately and reused responsibly.
- 4. E-Waste Management: AUH tracks and responsibly disposes of electronic waste, often opting for equipment buy-back and recycling. The university collaborates with approved suppliers for recycling and eco-friendly disposal.
- Research on Sustainable Practices: Faculty and students conduct research on sustainable tourism, waste management, and environmental conservation. Projects include sustainable tourism post-COVID, urban waste management, and sustainable resource management.

13 CLIMATE

SDG 13

Amity University Haryana (AUH) is actively pursuing Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) 13, Climate Action, through various initiatives aimed at minimizing environmental impact and promoting sustainability on campus and beyond.

Key Initiatives:

- 1. Living Laboratory of Sustainability: AUH implements eco-friendly practices, including "nature-just" development, green buildings, and renewable energy sources. The campus preserves native vegetation, supports biodiversity, and integrates sustainable design in infrastructure.
- 2. Low Carbon Transition: AUH is working towards carbon neutrality by 2028 through solar energy installations, LED lighting, and biogas plants. The university minimizes carbon emissions by reducing reliance on grid electricity and encouraging the use of public transport.
- 3. Environmental Education and Research: AUH incorporates sustainability and climate science into academic programs, offering courses in environmental studies, renewable energy, and green building. Partnerships with organizations such as NASA and IITM support air quality and climate research, with facilities like 24/7 air quality monitoring.
- 4. **Policy and Governance:** AUH's Environmental and Sustainability Policy outlines goals for reducing water and carbon footprints through rainwater harvesting, waste management, and renewable energy use. The university's efforts have earned it the LEED Platinum certification.
- 5. Stakeholder Engagement and Community Outreach: AUH hosts numerous events, such as workshops and educational visits, focused on sustainability and climate awareness. Collaborations with government and research agencies help extend AUH's impact on climate action.
- 6. **Research and Innovation:** The university is a hub for climate-related research, producing numerous publications and patents focused on sustainable technologies, air pollution control, and renewable energy.

Amity University Haryana's commitment to climate action and sustainability reflects its role as a model institution, integrating green practices into all facets of campus life while engaging stakeholders in efforts to combat climate change.



SDG 14

Amity University Haryana is actively working to reduce marine pollution and conserve water resources, including local ponds and groundwater. The university believes that sustainable management of natural resources is essential for social and economic progress. It aims to protect oceans, freshwater, and biodiversity while educating students, who represent future leaders, on these issues.

The university offers various undergraduate and postgraduate courses focused on Sustainable Development Goals. Courses like Sustainability Science, Environmental Pollution, and Climate Change Adaptation are available, attracting 64 students interested in these subjects as minor or value-added options.

To support sustainable practices, the university has established a Waste Management Policy acknowledged by all stakeholders and signed contracts for the maintenance of sewage treatment plants (STPs) and effluent treatment plants (ETPs) to ensure the availability of safe water on campus. The Solid Waste Management Policy aims to protect the environment, conserve resources, and reduce waste toxicity.

Rainwater harvesting is a crucial aspect of the university's sustainability strategy, with an elaborate system of 43 wells and 112 bores designed to maximize rainwater collection. Regular cleaning of these systems ensures effective groundwater recharge. The university also strives for zero water discharge by treating and reusing wastewater from various sources on campus.

The wastewater generated is categorized and treated through STPs and ETPs, which helps conserve water and lessen environmental impact. The university monitors its water usage and promotes sustainable practices, including rainwater harvesting and the use of water-efficient technologies. All harvesting pits are cleaned annually before the monsoon season.

The university has received funding for a project to clean wastewater near Bilaspur village using advanced technology, transforming it into a clean water source. This initiative has led to community engagement and education around water management.

Efforts to minimize plastic use on campus include encouraging the use of paper and jute bags. Various sustainability initiatives, such as Swachh Bharat Abhiyan and herbal gardening, support these goals.

Research at the university focuses on sustainable environmental practices, including studies on forest ecosystems and the effects of pollution. Several publications highlight the impacts of plastic and pesticide contamination in water and soil.

Recent events at the university included World Water Day celebrations to raise awareness about water issues and a seminar on advanced materials for water remediation. Staff and students engage in community outreach to inform locals about the negative effects of water pollution on aquatic life, reinforcing the importance of clean water for ecosystems and human health.



SDG 15

Amity University Haryana, located in the Aravallis region, is committed to promoting sustainability and protecting terrestrial ecosystems in line with SDG 15: Life on Land. The university maintains a lush green campus with over 30,000 plant species, herbal gardens, organic farms, and initiatives for sustainable land management. The university focuses on conserving biodiversity, educating the community, and advancing eco-friendly technologies. Forests are vital for human existence, providing oxygen, food, shelter, fuel, and livelihood for tribal communities. Goal 15 of the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals focuses on ensuring the sustainability of life on Earth by promoting the conservation and sustainable use of terrestrial ecosystems.

Efforts to achieve this goal include planting largescale tree planting events, water conservation and harvesting, green campus initiatives, herbal gardens, pollution control activities, reducing polythene usage, biogas units, organic farming, and harvesting solar energy. The university also establishes the "AYUSH -AMITY Herbal Garden and Medicinal Plants Distribution Centre" in partnership with the Ministry of AYUSH, which serves as a valuable resource for cultivating and distributing medicinal plants, contributing to biodiversity conservation and sustainable development.





SDG 16

Amity University Haryana is committed to promoting peaceful and inclusive societies, providing access to justice for all, and building effective, accountable institutions at all levels. The university aligns with human rights by promoting societies that respect individual rights, privacy, freedom of expression, and access to information. The university offers various courses covering SDG 16 and aims to create a peaceful society devoid of violence and fear. Students have a wide range of options for courses, including a Military Training course, Communication Skills, Behaviour Science, and Foreign Languages.

Governance measures are implemented to ensure justice, fairness, and ethical behavior. The university's e-Governance effectively manages funding, administration, planning, and testing, with grievance and disciplinary procedures for employees and students. The university's organizational structure supports the maintenance of institutional capacity and the efficacy of education through various committees and boards.

Financial information is audited and made publicly available on the university's website. Participatory bodies for stakeholder engagement are also in place to ensure transparency and accountability in the university's operations.



This course equipped students with knowledge, skills, and motivation to tackle global challenges, fostering proactive community engagement and sustainable solutions. Through experiential learning, case studies, and collaborations with local communities, students will develop practical skills and nuanced understanding of sustainability complexities. Actionable strategies for addressing Sustainable Development Goals students, during their summer break engaged with the Community based organizations like Self-help groups, non-governmental organizations, volunteerism, corporate social responsibility, local bodies such as gram panchayat, Anganwadi, Resident Welfare Association and alike.



During the 3 weeks of their engagement with the community, students opted to address the issues specific to alleviate hunger, promote and crate awareness for good health and wellbeing, promoting quality education, addressing gender inequalities, significance of sanitation and clean water, waste management and recycling and many more.

Students from AUH actively supported the 17 SDG Goals and contributed majorly to the areas pertaining to SDG 3, SDG 4, SDG 5, SDG 6, SDG 10, SDG 11, SDG 15.





Understanding the significance of SDG 3, the students of Amity Medical School have undertaken a diverse range of community projects addressing critical health issues and promoting holistic well-being. Their investigations have explored the impact of proper hygiene, nutrition, and exercise on overall health; the transformative potential of sustainable yoga and nutrition practices; and the harmful effects of medication on human health. Other studies have focused on metabolic diseases, dietary awareness, food safety and security, eating out habits and obesity, cholesterol management, and malnutrition. Conducted in various regions, including Kuwait, Haryana, Bihar, and Uttar Pradesh, these studies demonstrate the students' commitment to understanding and addressing health disparities, particularly in vulnerable communities. By employing mixed-methods approaches, surveys, and educational interventions, these initiatives aim to inform evidence-based practices, promote healthy behaviors, and contribute to the betterment of public health outcomes. Community Engagement initiatives



Students from Amity school of Biotechnology undertook various community engagement projects focusing on social and environmental issues. The projects included working with NGOs for sustainable growth, addressing gaps in societal development, and promoting social justice. Animal protection and welfare, including veterinary practices and raising awareness about animal welfare issues, Palliative care programs, integrating physiotherapy to enhance patient outcomes and quality of life. Community mobilization and empowerment, forming self-help groups for rural women, healthcare support in government hospitals, bridging gaps between patients and healthcare providers, educational initiatives, including teaching in government schools, promoting educational equity, environmental conservation through tree plantation drives. social work and volunteering in hospitals, addressing multifaceted patient needs, Solid waste management surveys, promoting sustainable urban development and projects with organizations like SUDHA Society, focusing on education and healthcare initiatives. Nevertheless, these projects demonstrate the students' commitment to social responsibility, community engagement, and sustainable development, aligning with the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Similarly other students of Amity University Haryana- Amity Business School, Amity College of Commerce, Amity school of Economics, Amity school of Behavioral and applied science, Amity Institute of Information Technology, Amity School of Applied Sciences and Environmental Sciences, Liberal Arts, School of Communication have contributed to the community by taking up projects related to Learning, Growth and Development" at Lotus Petal Foundation, focusing on donor engagement and data management. Empowering Individuals with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities" at Uma Educational & Technical Society (UETS), enhancing life skills and social interaction. Bridging Gaps through Quality Education" with Badlaav Foundation, supporting underprivileged students. Community Engagement and Social Awareness Through Education" with Taleem Society, promoting education and health awarenes. Promoting Good Health and Well-Being through NGO Work," educating communities on healthy lifestyles and hygiene.
