Rendering technique through Staedtler (Pencil colors)







21st September 2023 (Thursday)

Amity School of Fashion Design & Technology (ASFDT), AUMP, organized a workshop on "Fabric Manipulation Technique". The workshop was coordinated and taught by Ms Vidhu Gupta and Ms Madhavi Tomar, Asst. Professors, ASFDT.

The term "Fabric Manipulation" (also known as "Textile Manipulations") refers to playing with a fabric to alter its look, drape, or shape. Typically, the goal is for the fabric to transition from a flat state to a three-dimensional state. For example, Fabric manipulations are techniques that reshape a fabric or textile surface. In general, textile manipulation techniques in fashion design produce distinctive details and textures and also have an impact on the final shape and silhouette of the garment. The use of fabric manipulations is typically limited to textile art, interior design, and fashion design. It's a great way to recycle fabric scraps and upcycle old clothing. This workshop was beneficial for all the semesters. Total strength of 25 students has been participated. Ms. Vidhu Gupta gave the hands on training on different techniques of fabric manipulation like smocking, pleating and bubbling. Students created beautiful samples and enthusiastically participated in the workshop. The end result was fantastic.

# "Workshop on Jute Art"

16th January 2024 (Tuesday)

The Amity School of Fashion Design and Technology Department at Amity University Madhya Pradesh has organised a workshop on 16<sup>th</sup> of Jan 2024 from 9:30 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. on the topic 'Jute Art. The resource person of the workshop was Ms. Nupur Shrivastava a Pedilite instructor. The workshop coordinated by Ms. Madhavi Tomar & Ms Vidhu Gupta, Assistant Professor at Amity School of Fashion Design and Technology.

The workshop began with the introduction of the expert, Mrs. Nupur Shrivastava, a Fevicryl Instructor. The workshop aimed to teach a new craft of Jute Art using moldit clay. Ms. Nupur explained to students that Jute art with Pedilite Moldit clay can be a fun and creative project. She demonstrated how to create a design with the Moldit clay on the base of jute to make a small decorative article. She explained the technique of using the Pedilite moldit clay by kneading it until it is soft and pliable. Then, it can be shaped into a base for jute art. Various shapes or designs can be created from the moldit and stuck onto the jute base with the help of glue. Once the clay dries, color can be applied to convert it into a beautiful decorative article. Students enthusiastically participated in the workshop, designing different articles.

The workshop was a memorable experience for the students as they learned how to use Moldit to create aesthetically appealing jute articles. All the students participated enthusiastically, and the workshop enhanced the creativity of young minds, providing great exposure. A total of 30 students participated in the workshop.


