























ESTABLISHMENT OF AMITY UNIVERSITY MADHYA PRADESH

ABOUT AMITY UNIVERSITY MADHYA PRADESH

Amity University Madhya Pradesh (AUMP) was established by Ritnand Balved Education Foundation (RBEF) at Gwalior by Madhya Pradesh Niji Vishwavidyalaya (Sthapna Avam Sanchalan) Adhiniyam – 2007 and Dwitiya Sanshodhan Adhiniyam (No. 27 of 2010) vide State Government Notification No. 7692-406 dated 30 Dec 2010, with the view to promote professional, industry-oriented education in the state of Madhya Pradesh. Amity University Madhya Pradesh, Gwalior located on a sprawling campus of 102 acres of land opposite Gwalior Airport, imparts modern, practical and research-oriented courses which lead to the development of professionals who are employable and industry ready. This in turn drives the socio-economic upliftment of the region.

Amity University Madhya Pradesh (AUMP) imparts education in almost all areas including management, engineering, architecture, biotechnology, law, Journalism & mass communication, behavioral science, Psychology, fashion, Political Science, Pharmacy etc.

AUMP has state of the art infrastructure with modern amenities which matches with the best across the country and is of international standards. The whole campus is wi-fi enabled. Electricity is available 24X7 and all the buildings are air conditioned.

The university has its own intranet named AMIZONE (Acronym for Amity Intranet Zone), which is equipped to store all the academics and administrative data of the university, thus promoting digitalization. Session Plans, Lesson Plans, Examination Details, Fee Details, Payment Details, Attendance Report, Grievance Redressal, and other administrative details are all available through AMIZONE. The students can access study materials and tutorials anytime, anywhere which is a step towards beyond class room teaching. Mentor Mentee systems are in placed in the campus with an objective of mentoring and recognizing the potential of students and help improve their self-esteem and confidence. Apart from this trained counsellors have been appointed to provide prompt assistance on issues related to health and emotional wellness.

The courses offered by AUMP are evaluated regularly to achieve the course objectives based on the feedback on placement, employability and latest development in technology to keep pace with the changing times. Faculties and students of AUMP are encouraged to carry out industry oriented cutting edge research work in the university. The faculties of AUMP have been successful in getting several sponsored projects from various state and national funding agencies.

Grooming and etiquette, Communication Enhancement Classes, Behavioural Science, One Foreign Language, Pre-placement Training Classes, and Aptitude Training Classes are a part of curriculum, which helps in overall development of the students. The University offers a Choice Based Credit System, wherein a student can select any one of the 38 minor tracks across discipline.

In terms of placement, AUMP has consistently achieved outstanding results, with an average annual campus placement rate exceeding 90% over the past five years (2018-2019, 2019-2020, 2020-2021, 2021-2022, and 2022-2023). Notably, the highest annual CTC offered last year was INR 14.95 Lac by CISCO, and this year, it has reached INR 34.5 Lac PA, offered by COMMVAULT. The average annual CTC package has also seen a remarkable 20% improvement compared to the previous year.

The University was ranked under Top 200 in the University Category by National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) India Ranking 2020 and Amity Institute of Engineering Technology was all India ranked between 151-200 rank band in the year 2023, 153rd in the year 2022, 154th in the year 2021 and 162nd in the year 2020 in Engineering Category.

Amity University Madhya Pradesh was awarded as the Best Private University in Madhya Pradesh in years 2014 by CMAI Association of India and in years 2017, 2018 and 2019 by Dialogue India Group. Amity University Madhya Pradesh was also awarded Excellent Higher Education University in India by CMAI Association of India in 2017. The University was awarded "Utkrisht Vishwavidyalaya Samman" by Madhya Pradesh Private University Regulatory Commission, Bhopal in 2018. The University has bestowed with 'Excellent University Award 2020' by Zee News. AUMP has been awarded a Five Star Rating under "Eat Right Campus" Competition conducted by Food Standard, Safety Authority of India under the aegis of "Eat Right India" campaign launched by Govt. of India. The University also rated 3 Star in University ranking released by Institutions' Innovation Council, Ministry of Education 01 Dec 2021. The University was secured 2nd rank under band performer in Atal Ranking of Institutions on Innovation Achievements (ARIIA Ranking 2021).

THE Impact Rankings 2022 AUMP has ranked 301-400 out of 960 Institutions under SDG for Decent Work and Economic Growth.

The University has been accredited as "Premier University" by Accreditation Service for International Colleges (ASIC).

The Journal of Content, Community & Communication (JCCC) published by AUMP is Scopus Indexed and ranked first media journal in India and 5th in Asia. the University has established following five Centre of Excellence:

ACT & NOTIFICATION

Amity University Madhya Pradesh has been established by the Ritnand Balved Education Foundation (RBEF), New Delhi which is a society registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 and was established by the Madhya Pradesh Legislature through an amendment in Madhya Pradesh Niji Vishwavidyalay (Sthapna Avam Sanchalan) Adhiniyam – 2007 as Madhya Pradesh Act (No. 27 of 2010) vide State Government Notification No. 7692-402-इक्कीस—अ—प्रा dated 30.12.2010, and is recognized by UGC vide letter No. 8-33/2010 (CPP- I/PU) dated 24.08.2011.

The First Statutes of the University were published in Madhya Pradesh Gazette on 28.12.2012 vide Notification No. 52 and the First Ordinances of the University were published in Madhya Pradesh Gazette on 05.04.2013 vide Notification No. 14.

Functional and Academic reforms done wrt the Course Structures & Examination for Implementation of NEP 2020 in Amity University Madhya Pradesh.

- 1. For Undergraduate three years degree course minimum credit requirement is reduced to 120 from 150.
- 2. For four-year degree courses minimum credit requirement has also reduced to 160 from 200 (as per AUMP curriculum structure).
- 3. Whole curriculum structure in r/o B.A, B.Sc., BBA, B.Com, BCA and BJMC programmes has been revised as per the ordinance 38A.

All computer labs are well maintained by a dedicated IT staff and have latest hardware and licensed Application and System software available on the system. The softwares take care of the needs of all the students. As an ongoing process, these labs are



upgraded regularly with software as per syllabi of the students.

About The Library

Books and Journals available in the Library (Updated)

The Library holds a rich collection of more than 36566 books with more than 7031 Titles, near about 97 plus Journal, 17 Newspapers and 25 Magazines. These are extremely useful in the studies of students, research scholars and faculty members of engineering, management, law, pharmacy, biotechnology, journalism, fashion, architecture, psychology etc. Apart from these subject wise books other books are also available for the student to make him a responsible citizen of the nation. The books of Pioneer, Philosopher, Writer, motivator's book like Satyarth Prakash by Maharishi Dayanand Saraswati, Hamlet, Tempest by William Shakespeare, Life of Pie by Martel, Yann, Vilkashan Jannayak, "Hindutva For Changing Times" written by Shri J. Nand kumar etc. famous in their subject field are kept for reading and motivating for Students/scholars.

E-Resources: The Library of AUMP is enriched with more than 7500 e- materials like e- Books, e- Magazines, Conference Proceedings, & Audio-visual Lectures etc. via our own domain i.e., Amizone.net, where all e-resources are available for AUMP users.

Beside this the central Library along with 06 departmental Libraries are fully Automated by KOHA Library management (Software). All these libraries are running under the supervision of fully trained and knowledgeable library staff.

The University also has the membership of very reputed Learning & Reading platforms like DELNET, All India Reporter (AIR), Supreme court cases Online (SSC Online), World E- Books Library (WEL), South Asian Archives and National Digital Library. The University has also signed an MoU with Shodhganga (INFLIBNET).

The Research scholars & student can use the e-material of AUMP not only from the library they can also access the e-materials from their home via remote access through amizone.net



Hostels



The University has four large hostels, two for boys and two for girls with capacity of around 822 students accommodation. Separate facilities for boys and girls, caring wardens, and tight security ensure a pleasant stay for students. The mantra of Amity hostel staff is to create a 'home away from home' for all hostel students. (Updated)



This is achieved by ensuring 24 hours power and water supply, clean, well-lit, spacious rooms, common rooms with television, geysers in bathrooms, and windows with wire mesh to keep out mosquitoes. Each student is provided with a separate bed, mattress, pillow and study table. Each hostel is surrounded by a boundary wall and entry to the hostel is restricted to only those students who are staying in hostel. The hostellers are required to show their identity cards to the security personnel posted at hostel gates and also sign their entry using bio-metric device installed in each hostel. All hostels are Wi-Fi enabled, and the students can access the net 24/7 from their rooms. The students are provided a free laundry service and have 24 hours access to the Medical Room.

Cafeterias:

In addition to the students' Mess located in the hostels, the University has 05 cafeterias, Momo Mafia, Nestle Parlor and 01 Milk parlor. Each academic block has one cafeteria, which serves hot, hygienic and good quality food at highly subsidized rates. The cafeteria makes a vibrant & informal meeting place for the students where friendships for a lifetime are nurtured. The quality of the food is monitored on a regular basis by a committee comprising University officials and students. The University has 01 mess and 3 Dining Hall for serving of food.





Auditorium:

A State-of-the-art auditorium with a combined seating capacity of over 600 persons acts as a common ground for students, faculty and corporate personalities for regular interfaces, conferences and other events. This auditorium facilitates in bringing students face to face with global thought leaders, academic gurus and corporate heads to share their experiences.



Seminar Halls:

Amity has 04 Seminar Halls with a seating capacity of 300 each. Extremely well designed, the Seminar Halls have all the audio-visual facilities for conducting seminars, conferences and guest lectures for a large gathering of students.



Conference Halls:

There are 05 Conference Halls in the University, one each in Academic Blocks A, B, C, D & E. These conference halls are equipped with audio-visual aids and can be used for video/audio conferencing as well as presentations.



Moot Court:

Amity has a state-of-the-art moot court which is constantly engaged in providing a hands-on learning experience to the students of Law.




Studio:


Offices and Faculty Rooms:

Amity is committed to the welfare of its staff and students. To enable a harmonious teaching-learning environment, the teaching faculty and staff members are accommodated in 49 staff cabins and 178 workstations which are spread across all Academic Blocks.



Institutional Networking:

Entire Campus including Hostel is Wi-Fi enabled. Additionally, telephones with networking facility to connect to other Amity Universities and Delhi Office have also been provided. A dedicated bandwidth of 500 MBPS is available.

Studio Type Accommodation for Faculty:

Amity provides studio type accommodations to its faculty and staff. 10 such well-furnished studio apartments are available in the campus.



Stationary Shop:

Amity University Madhya Pradesh also has a stationery shop in its campus and is managed by a contractor. Students/faculty members/Staff can avail the facility during the working hours. Apart from the stationery items it also facilitates photocopy (both color and black & white), Scanning, Printing, Lamination and Internet facilities.



ATM (Automated Teller Machine):

In order to facilitate the students, staff of Amity University ATM Facility is available at prime location in the University campus.



Medical Facility:

The medical room is located within the hostel so that the students can easily avail medical care. For emergencies and major medical problems an ambulance is available to ferry the sick to multi-specialty hospitals. A male as well as female Medical Assistant for boys and girls promote the necessary medical care. In addition to above Amity University also provides Group Medical Coverage (GMC) for their employees and staff to meet out the situation of any medical emergency and hospitalization.



SPORTS

The University has 20 acre sports complex which offers ample opportunities to students for regular work–out, lifestyle management and interaction by providing a host of excellent sports facilities. The University encourages sports and physical health amongst students and provide facilities for outdoor games like cricket, football, basketball, lawn tennis, volleyball as well as indoor games like chess, carom, table –tennis etc. In addition to that University has facility of Gym for Boys and Girls.



SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT

Amity University Madhya Pradesh ensure availability and sustainable management of water and sanitation for all. The university campus is charismatically clean & green, and all efforts are placed to make it an environmental friendly. Some of the initiatives undertaken by Amity University Madhya Pradesh are Rain Water Harvesting to improve the ground water table, waste sewage water treatment plant etc.

- 1. Solid waste is generated by all the staff, students and visitors who visit the campus regularly. This waste is generated in the form of packing materials, unserviceable/retrieved maintenance items, stationery paper, food items and dry leaves fallen from trees on the roads/ parking.
- 2. The stationery paper waste and other food items is collected in the waste bins (both degradable and non-degradable) installed in the academic blocks in sufficient numbers. The waste generated in the academic blocks is transported to the central waste rooms and further segregated into sellable and other unusable. And finally, both the sellable and unused waste is lifted by the local vendor for which he pays monthly charges.
- 3. The waste retrieved from maintenance items are sold quarterly/half yearly to the local vendor by Board of Staff ordered by Dir Admin.
- 4. The dry leaves fallen on the roads/parking, is collected by housekeeping staff and are transported to the compost pits available in the campus wherein they are dumped into the pits for making compost naturally.

LIQUID WASTE MANAGEMENT

- 1. Liquid waste is generated by all the staff, students and visitors visiting the campus regularly. This waste is generated in the form of sewerage and wastewater from toilets and cafeterias. This liquid is channelized to manhole's installed outside the blocks and further transported to the collection chambers and further lifted/raised through sewage pumps to the STPs installed in the campus.
- 2. 02 STPs of capacity 2.8 LLPD and 1.6 LLPD (Lakh liter/Day) respectively are installed for taking care of liquid waste generated in the campus. This waste is further treated with various process at STPs and finally treated water is used in toilets for flushing (in hostels) and for horticulture purposes.

WASTE RECYCLING SYSTEM

- 1. Liquid waste generated in academic blocks and hostels is transported to STPs through sewerage pipeline. And this waste is further treated with various process at STPs and finally treated/recycled water is used in toilets for flushing (in hostels) and for horticulture purposes.
- 2. The dry leaves/cutting waste obtained from hedge cutting/ tree trimming are further recycled/converted into compost naturally. And this compost is utilized in Campus horticulture.

RAIN WATER HARVESTING SYSTEM

Why do almost a million people go without daily access to safe water? How does climate change affect adequate water availability? And why does half the world's population go without adequate sanitation? The Water Without Borders program at Amity University Madhya Pradesh seeks to answer these questions and more.

Rainwater collection systems on campus reduce the university's dependence on municipal water systems, storing the collected water in cisterns. The water is filtered and disinfected for use for both drinking and non-drinking purposes. The Engineering Technology Building was designed to reflect the faculty's strategic plan, engineering a Sustainable Future, and features rainwater harvesting for wastewater flushing and landscape irrigation.

- 1. The University has 10 Nos of Borewells in the campus. The borewells dug in the campus do not have enough ground water to yield water continuously. Half of the borewells dry up during continuous pumping. To recharge these existing borewells and to restrict the out-flow of rainwater Amity University has constructed 10 Water Harvesting Pits of capacity 30,000 ltrs at various locations (Water Catchment Area) 10 conserve rainwater. These pits have been provided enough filter media to restrict the mud/silt during rains.
- 2. The above has brought sea change in saving of rainwater and has thus improved the water level, of our borewells which helps us in meeting our water requirement in peak summers.
- 3. This has also been applauded by Hon'ble High Court Gwalior MP Local Newspaper.

Transportation

Amity University Madhya Pradesh puts up with comprehensive Transport facility. University has a fleet of student -ready Buses on need basis to provide the facility to the students to reach the campus with comfort and safety and backup to help us provide the services most dependably. Number of Buses for the students from various parts of city for easy commutation. Al all levels, it is ensured that punctuality of the vehicles is maintained. Besides, public Transport is another option to reach the University campus.





GREEN INITIATIVES

Our Environmentally Conscious Campus integrates sustainable features including solar panels, sewage treatment plants, rainwater harvesting, a ban on single-use plastics, and prioritizes green, energy and routine environmental audits, fostering a commitment to a cleaner and greener future for all.

With an aim to promote clean and green energy, the University has successfully installed roof top solar panels in its 03 Academic Blocks with a total capacity of 305 KW. The electricity bill has been reduced by its earlier amount approximately 10% per month of the total bill amount.

Keeping in view the Global warming and changing climate action consequences Amity University Madhya Pradesh taken urgent action to combat climate change and its impacts by Plantation of more than 13600 trees in the campus.

The University has participated in Inter University Swachchh Bharat Abhiyan competition twice in year 2017 and in year 2018. The effort was appreciated by the Inspecting Team for making clean and green environment in a short duration. The University has maintained the existing and added to the Land scape Environment of the Campus. The layout of the land has not been disturbed and existing hill features have been used for layout of the entire Campus. This has made the campus layout beautiful and has been appreciated by all dignities and visitors visiting the campus.

The borewells dug in the campus have not enough ground water to yield water continuously. Half numbers of the borewells dry up during continuous pumping. To recharge these existing borewells and to restrict the out-flow of rainwater Amity University arranged to construct 10 Nos of Water Harvesting Pits of capacity 30,000 ltrs at various location (Water Catchment Area) to conserve rainwater. The above has brought sea change in saving of rainwater and has thus improved the water level, of our borewells which helps us in meeting our water requirement in peak summers.










ADMISSION GRAPH 2011-2023


