consistently and regularly providing financial support and assistance in terms of On admission & Continuation of On admission Scholarship to all eligible/meritorious students who has taken admission in the year 2022 and also studying in the University. Amity University Madhya Pradesh is a partner in the many International Universities some of them is the offshore campus of the Amity Universities to provide professional and personal skills and capabilities on Higher Education and Research for Sustainable Development for faculty members and students.

Policy made for Employee:

The Amity University Madhya Pradesh Community brings together faculty, students and staff not just with community groups, but also with people living in poverty. It ensures policy development is fully informed by people with firsthand knowledge about what it means to be poor. As a Centrally regulated campuses, Amity University Madhya Pradesh advocates for a minimum wage that allows employees and staffs to earn enough to pull themselves and their families out of poverty, which affects health, education levels and the community's economic prosperity. Amity University also provides Group Medical Coverage (GMC) for their employees and Group Accidental Policy (GPA) for the students to meet out the situation of any medical emergency and hospitalization.

Financial aid to deserving candidates

The University is committed to helping deserving students such that finance is a smooth process in the educational journey of exceptional students. Based on eligibility criteria and University Policy for On admission and Continuation of Admission Scholarships, the University offers Financial Aid and Scholarships to students selected through the specified admission criteria(s) in undergraduate programs, covering part or entire academic expenses.

The Amity University Madhya Pradesh is successfully advocated for lower the barriers struggling and meritorious students by given Rs. 78,26,850/- to 180 students for Continuation of On Admission scholarships in slab of 25%, 50% and 100% of annual fee. In the year 2022-23 Amity University Madhya Pradesh 650 students received about total of Rs. 2,77,70,500/- in bursaries named as On Admission Scholarship.

Skill development program At AUMP, we are committed to educational opportunities for all people regardless of gender, race, religion, or ethnicity; hence the University has undertaken a Skill Development Program by its NSS Units. The program imparts critical life skills to the children of the

University's contractual staff residing in nearby areas and enhances their prospects for a brighter tomorrow. The faculty and students at the University volunteer to impart classes to children to improve their computer and language skills.

Help in Crises Amity University providing emergency financial support to students in need through tie-up with Banks and including those facing a lack of funds for their research and project work or required technology for courses, through its own Research and Development Department of the University and with the help state and central funded agencies.

National Service Scheme unit of AUMP organized a voluntary blood donation camp on 29th March 2023 in the university campus. The Blood Donation Camp was inaugurated with the opening remarks of Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, AUMP Lt Gen V K Sharma, (AVSM). Faculty, students, staff members and NSS volunteers of AUMP enthusiastically contributed to the blood donation drive and selflessly **donated 250 units** of blood. Students and faculty from other educational institutes also contributed enthusiastically in the voluntary blood donation drive. The camp concluded at 1710 hr. with the closing remarks by Hon'ble Lt Gen V K Sharma, VC, AUMP and Pro Vice Chancellor, Amity University, Prof. (Dr.) M P Kaushik who praised the whole hearted efforts, enthusiasm, team work, devotion and leadership skills of the NSS volunteers, teachers and the administrative staff for the precise arrangements. He also thanked the authorities of JA Hospital for their cooperation and hard work.
