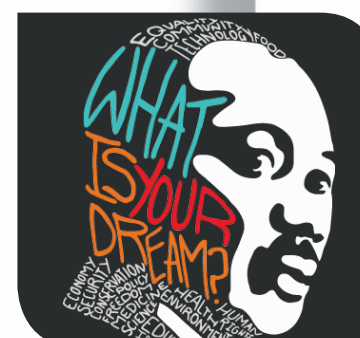

# CONVOCATION 2015

Quality of the mind determines the future of the nation, says N. R. Narayana Murthy

Amity University Rajasthan held a special convocation on Sunday, January 25th- 2015, to honour Nagavara Ramarao Narayana Murthy (Industrialist) and pioneer in information technology. The university was honoured to present "Doctor Honoris Causa in Philosophy" on the eminent industrialist. The degree was handed over to him by our Honourable Chancellor Dr Aseem Chauhan. The event was attended by eminent personalities including the Chancellor, Vice-Chancellor, Pro-VC and Dr W. Selvamurthy,

It was an immense pleasure and a great honour in having N. R. Narayana Murthy with us. According to our Chancellor, he is a great inspiration to Amitians.

In his 25-minute mesmerizing address to Amitians and teachers he emphasised on discipline, time management, responsibility, commitment, innovation and new aspiring ideas of youth. he has taken classroom on learning was it should not be merely an effort to encourage students to secure the first position. He said it should ensure solutions to problems of life.

To illustrate this he narrated the following experience. When some time ago he had visited an Indian school, he asked the students: Why do we have seasons? (Spring, autumn, summer etc.) There was no response. He explained the axial rotation of earth was the cause for



change in seasons.

A week later when he was in Tokyo he asked the same question to a Japanese girl who replied correctly. He asked her what if the axis was tilted a bit what would happen. The 12-year-old asked, "Why would you want Tokyo to be covered by snow always?"

His idea behind the anecdote was proper implementation of classroom learning. Dr Narayana Murthy said it's not about studying and mugging up. The classroom learning has to be implemented on a day-to-day basis.

He assured the youngsters that if any work or study was done with determination along with the modern equipment and classroom learning it would be a great boost to every youth. He said his teachers never allowed him to ask questions or think of one...! He says time has changed. Students need to study their course material at their house and come back prepared to discuss and ask questions and solve problems.

He said that a "High Quality Mind" is the only way to build up a bright nation, creating institutions that help our youngsters to discuss and debate with the help of IT, data, facts and courtesy which is conducive to liberalization. His aim was to bring in responsibility in each individual to improve the quality of mind and help the less fortunate.

Dr Naryana Murthy advocated that the poorest child in India must get a decent education, shelter and healthcare and he encouraged all Amitians to work for it. He called upon students to ensure the following for a better society:

- Being a good citizen means abiding laws and being courteous and decent to strangers.
- Youth should give importance to the Nation rather than their personal life.
- Most importantly he highlighted the level of discipline to be followed by Indians. He said India is extremely poor in discipline which is a barrier to the

growth of our country.

He recalled a recent incident when he was invited as a chief guest for a function which was supposed to start at 6:00 pm but it started at 6:40 pm. He was scheduled to speak for 15 minutes. He walked towards the podium and spoke for only two minutes. He believes discipline translates to honesty, integrity and hard work.

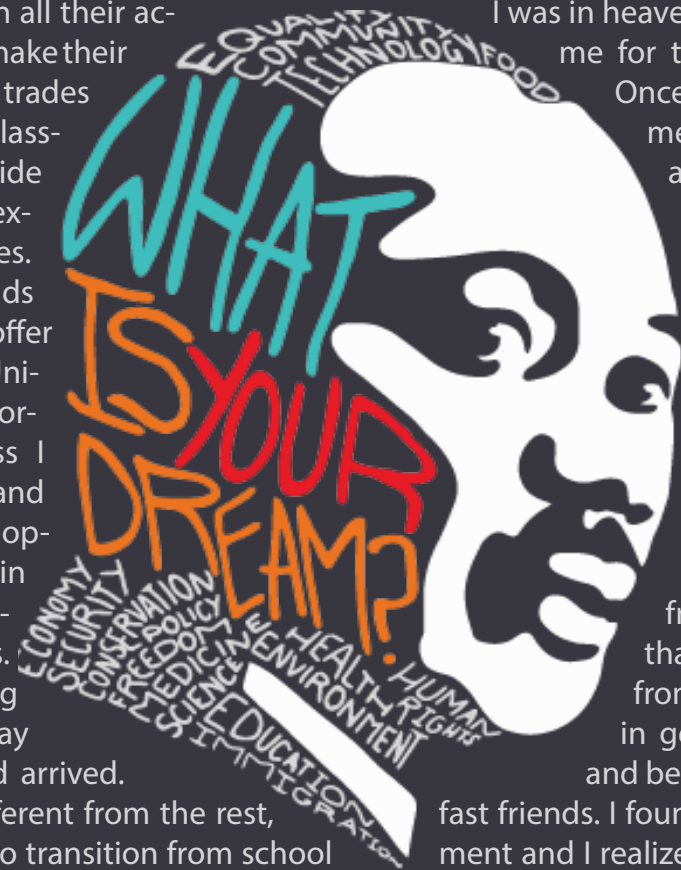
The moral of the story was the young generation will follow what the elders do. So the elders should be very careful in handling things and follow a disciplined way of living.

Beginning on March 2015 it has objectives such as the dream of education for all, especially the young, to provide literacy to all in the age group of 15-35 years.

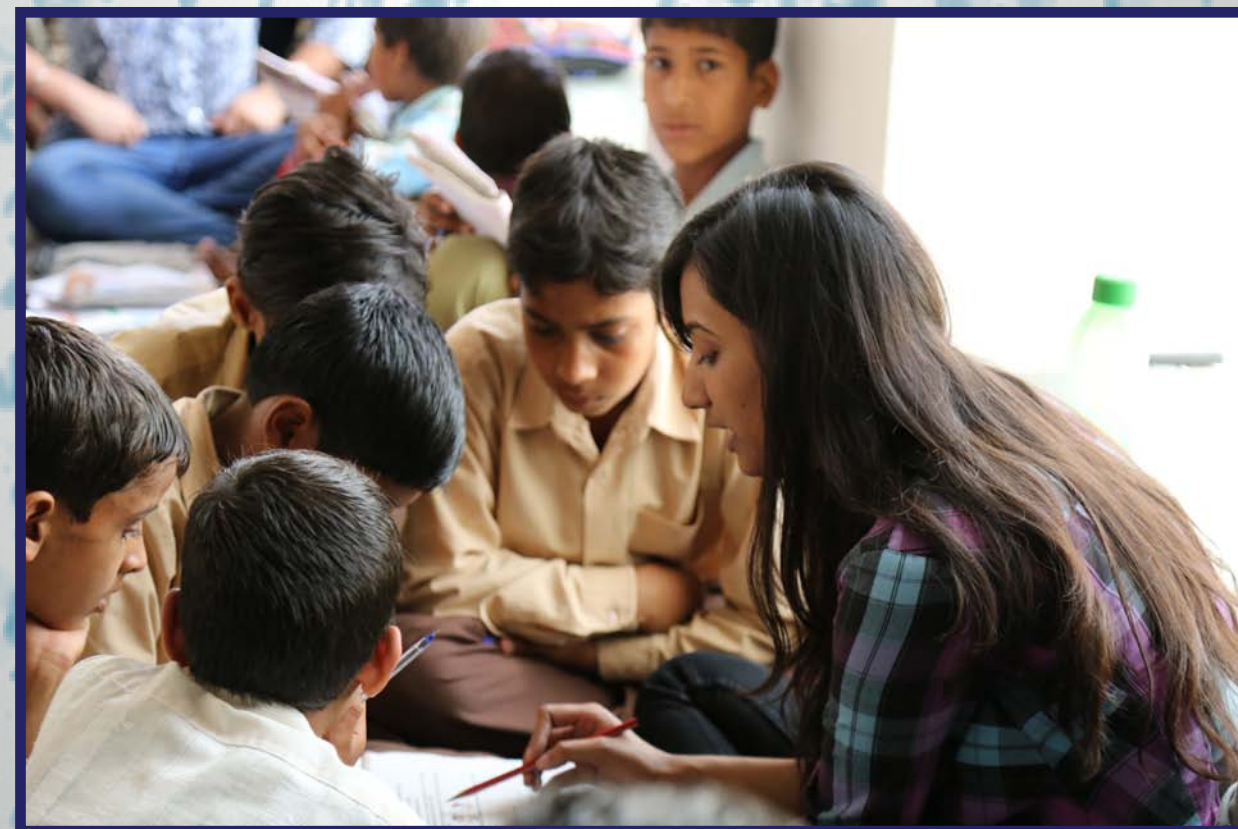

# PARADISE OF AMITY: THE GREEN COVER

“Time spent amongst trees is never wasted”

The pristine trees of Amity University Rajasthan campus greatly enhances the attraction of the campus. Amityans can be found enjoying their morning walks through the greenery on campus. During lunch break or after the classes are over for the day, students can be found seeking shade underneath the giant trees. Once, the sun goes down kids can be seen playing football, volleyball or basketball amidst the greenery.

As we walk around the campus of Amity University, we find ourselves enchanted by the lush green and serene environment around us. Amity has strategically designed its flora and fauna to enhance the landscape of the campus to its best ability. Human beings have had an intimate relationship with plants since time immemorial and it is exemplified in Amity's environment.

Just outside the main gate of Amity, *Cycas circinalis*, can be found. This species is prevalent to India. It has a palm like appearance but it is not a true palm. The plant takes several years to grow. Other than this one can also find Amla trees nearby (*Phyllanthus emblica*) which ripens in autumn. Students walking by can be found picking up ripened Amlas and popping them in their mouths for a quick sour snack.

While walking from Amity Business School to Amity School of Engineering (ASET) we find the Palm Drive, aptly named by the students lined with rows of Date Palms (*Phoenix dactylifera*). The date palm is dioecious tree. A huge amount is spent on purchasing and main-

taining these trees. The horticultural flowers near ABS are Petunias. It can tolerate relatively harsh conditions and relatively hot climates. In AUR, they are watered daily due to the dry conditions.

Amity is famous for its Neem Forest. It grows well in tropical and semi-tropical regions, which is best supported by the soils of Aravalli Hills. All around from the Security Office to ABS circle, we can see tall trees with yellow flowers.

These are none other than *Delonix regia*. It is noted for its fern like leaves and flamboyant display of flowers. It is known as Flame Trees.

At the Thadi or the tea stall near Amity Business School (ABS) one can see the beautiful Bamboo trees (*Dendrocalamus strictus*). The parking space near ABS has been beautified by the plantation of Kadamba trees (*Neolamarckia cadamba*). It has scented orange flowers in dense globe-shaped clusters. The flowers are used in perfumes.

The football ground has a line of trees called “Indian Tree of Heaven”. In Hindi, it is known as Mahanimba (*Ailanthus excelsa*), it is a large dioecious tree and gives flowers from January to March. Its bark is used in India as a powerful fever cure and tonic. The myriads of flowers that one would enjoy gazing at, the scents and the perfumes that we swoon over, the rich colors that attract us, are all there as an aid to beautify AUR campus.

Now near the faculty corner, one can see *Verbesina encelioides* which is a flowering plant, commonly known as Cowpea Daisy. It is a bright yellow and the species is

considered as an intruder, which spreads over fertile land quickly.

Amity employs a large number of gardeners who are responsible for the upkeep and maintenance of all the trees and plants on campus. Other than this, electronic sprinklers are installed all around the campus which help keep the ground wet and moist from maximum plant growth and greenery. Gardeners are responsible for regular weeding, planting and fertilizing of all trees. Last year during Amity Convocations, 2014 on World Plantation day Amity University was one of the few colleges that took the initiative to plant trees along the Palm Drive to increase the greenery on campus and support plantations throughout the city. These plants were supported with bamboo sticks and are have now one year later are maturing into strong foundations.

## Biological Terms

**Pollination :** Pollination is the process by which pollen is transferred from the anther (male part) to the stigma (female part) of the plant, thereby enabling fertilization and reproduction. This takes place in the angiosperms, the flower bearing plants.

**Autogamy:** self-fertilization, especially the self pollination of a flower.

**Xenogamy:** fertilization of a flower by pollen from a flower on a genetically different plant.

**Xerarch:** developing in a dry place

**Pioneer:** a person who is among the first to explore or settle a new country or area.

**Xerophytic:** A xerophyte (from Greek xero dry, phuton plant) is a species of plant that has adapted to survive in an environment with little water, such as a desert or an ice- or snow-covered region in the Alps or the Arctic.

**Mesophytic:** Mesophytes are terrestrial plants which

are adapted to neither a particularly dry nor particularly wet environment. An example of mesophytic habitat would be a rural temperate meadow, which might contain goldenrod, clover, oxeye daisy, and *Rosa multiflora*.

**Dioecious:** (of a plant or invertebrate animal) having the male and female reproductive organs in separate individuals.

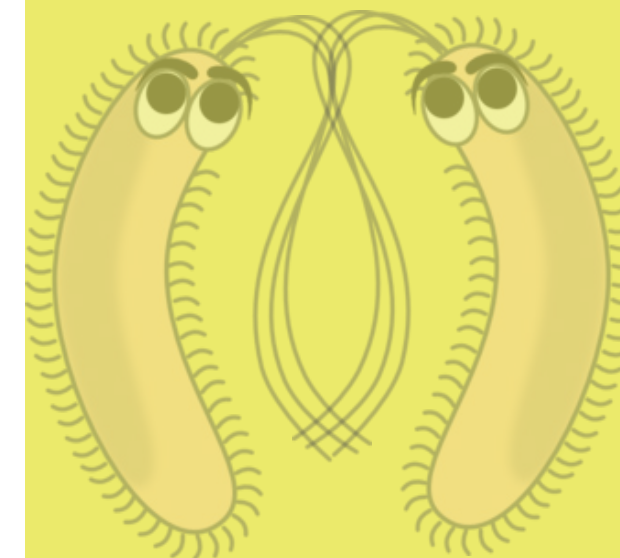
**Monoecious:** (of a plant or invertebrate animal) having both the male and female reproductive organs in the same individual; hermaphrodite.

**Bulbils:** a small bulb-like structure, in particular one in the axil of a leaf, which may fall to form a new plant.

**Glabrous:** (chiefly of the skin or a leaf) free from hair or down; smooth.

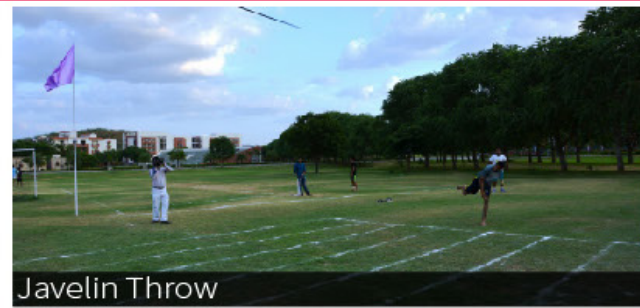
**Copiously:** . large in quantity or number; abundant; plentiful

**Lenticels:** one of many raised pores in the stem of a woody plant that allows gas exchange between the atmosphere and the internal tissues.
