1. Clinical Healthcare Services & Health Camps (SDG 3.8, 3.7)

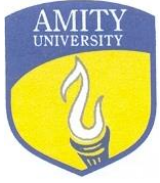
AUR provides on-campus healthcare access and periodic medical camps through collaborations with hospitals and healthcare professionals.

2. Sexual & Reproductive Health Awareness Programs (SDG 3.7, SDG 5.6)

The Gender Cell (ICC) conducts targeted programs addressing reproductive health and menstrual hygiene.

- Session on Women's Health & Menstrual Hygiene
 - Delivered by a senior gynecologist Dr. Suman Kanwar, a Senior Gynecologist from Pratap IVF Center, Jaipur
 - Participants: ~25 (faculty, staff, scholars)
- Additional programs:
 - Mental health & gender bias awareness (~150 participants)
 - Gender neutrality & empowerment sessions (~200 participants)



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Gender Cell Spearheads Women's Wellness and IVF Awareness with a Session on Women's Health and Menstrual Hygiene

The Gender Cell of Amity University Rajasthan organized a significant event focusing on a holistic approach towards women's health and menstrual hygiene. The session was facilitated by Pratap IVF and Fertility Center, Jaipur. The event commenced with an enlightening address by Dr. Suman Kanwar, a Senior Gynaecologist at Pratap IVF Centre, Jaipur. Dr. Kanwar provided an in-depth discussion on menstruation and the intricacies of IVF. In her address, she said, "In Vitro Fertilization is an important option for women who are struggling with infertility. It provides hope and a potential pathway to parenthood when natural conception is not possible. IVF can help women with various fertility issues, including blocked fallopian tubes, ovulation disorders, and unexplained infertility. IVF empowers women to achieve their dreams of having a family. Understanding and considering IVF can open up new possibilities and bring the joy of motherhood within reach for many who might otherwise lose hope. Followed by an insightful talk from Dr. Vikram Kanwar, Pratap IVF Centre, who added further perspective on the subject. A highlight of the event was a competition designed to test the mental skills of the participants through three rigorous rounds comprising a general knowledge and current affairs round, a cognitive skills and attitude-based round followed by value-based



round. The jury comprised esteemed personalities including Prof. Amla Batra, Emeritus Scientist at CSIR; Ms. Sadhana Garg, a veteran journalist and social entrepreneur; and Ms. Aparna Sahay, an ex-civil servant from the Government of Rajasthan. After an intense and competitive series of rounds, the award was bagged by Dr. Sonal Khandelwal, Assistant Professor, Amity Business School, Dr. Pallavi Mishra, Associate Professors, Amity School of Communication and Dr. Tanushri Mukherjee, Associate Professors, Amity School of Communication. Their exemplary performance showcased their exceptional mental acuity and understanding of the topics discussed. On the successful completion of the session, Prof. Amit Jain, Vice Chancellor- Amity University Rajasthan expressed his satisfaction and emphasised on the importance of such informative and interactive session. - Promotion of preventive healthcare practices

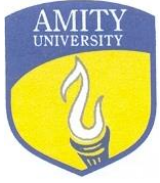
