Objective:

- To promote cleanliness and hygiene awareness among students and the community
- To encourage environmental responsibility and sustainable practices
- To enhance green cover through tree plantation
- To instill human values such as social responsibility, teamwork, and respect for nature

A brief report of the event:

In alignment with the objectives of Human Values & Community Outreach (HVCO), a Cleanliness Drive and Tree Plantation activity was organized to foster environmental consciousness and civic responsibility among students. The initiative aimed to address issues related to waste management, sanitation, and environmental degradation while promoting sustainable development practices. The activity commenced with a briefing session, where students were sensitized about the importance of cleanliness, waste segregation, and afforestation in maintaining ecological balance. The faculty coordinator highlighted the role of youth in building a clean and green society and emphasized the long-term impact of small collective actions.

Activities Conducted:

1. Cleanliness Drive:

- **Duration:** 3:30 P.M. – 4:15 P.M.
- **Details:** Students were divided into small groups and actively participated in cleaning the park premises and nearby public areas. Wearing gloves and using eco-friendly garbage bags, participants collected plastic waste, paper waste, and other non-biodegradable materials.
- The collected waste was segregated into biodegradable and non-biodegradable categories, and students were made aware of proper disposal methods. The drive helped reinforce the importance of maintaining cleanliness in public spaces and reducing environmental pollution.

2. Tree Plantation Drive:

- **Duration:** 4:15 P.M. – 5:00 P.M.
- **Details:** Following the cleanliness drive, a tree plantation activity was conducted within the public area. Students planted saplings of native and environmentally beneficial species at designated locations. Proper guidance was provided regarding planting techniques, watering, and post-plantation care to ensure sapling survival.
- Students pledged to take responsibility for nurturing the planted saplings, emphasizing long-term environmental stewardship rather than one-time participation.

Outcome of the Activity:

- Improved awareness about cleanliness and environmental conservation
- Enhanced student participation in community-oriented initiatives
- Contribution towards a cleaner and greener campus
- Development of teamwork, leadership, and human values among students

Conclusion:

Students connected to nature and reflected on their responsibility to be good citizens through a hands-on experience of cleaning up and planting trees. The experience gave students pride in being able to help clean up their neighborhoods and plant trees. In addition to the obvious physical and environmental benefits of the activities, students also learned important values and principles related to human interaction: empathy, teamwork, discipline, respect for the environment. The experience also helped the students understand that real sustainable change begins at the individual level and is supported by the commitment of all people. The initiative promoted a strong sense of community service, providing the students with values they will carry with them into their daily lives and into their future careers.
