The *Deeksharambh* Student Orientation Programme for the final year UG and PG students of the Faculty of Fine Arts, Applied Arts, Performing Arts, and Visual Arts was successfully held on 7th July 2025 in Room K1-402.

The session commenced with a warm welcome and an insightful address by Prof. (Dr.) Pradeep Joshi, Group Addl. Pro Vice-Chancellor and Dean of Applied Arts/Fine Arts/Performing Arts/Visual Arts. He briefed the students about the visual roadmap for the academic session 2025–26, outlining key milestones and expectations.

Prof. (Dr.) Pradeep Joshi, Group Addl. Pro Vice-Chancellor and Dean of Applied Arts/Fine Arts/Performing Arts/Visual Arts, emphasized upon the importance of the upcoming internship and placement process, scheduled for August 2026, and encouraged students to begin preparing early. A highlight of the session was the introduction of a collaborative project with HCL, where 18 senior batch students will get the opportunity to work on an industry-linked initiative, providing valuable hands-on experience and exposure to real-world project dynamics.

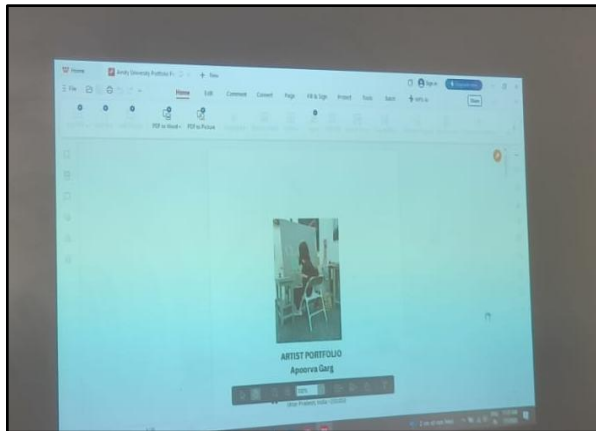

She also introduced the topic of Artificial Intelligence (AI), discussing how AI can support and enhance their creative journey. Through a conversational approach, she highlighted the importance of adapting to technological advancements in the creative field.

According to him, the priority should be to gain expertise and knowledge, as it is essential for growth in the creative industry.
