



## **Amity School of Fine Arts**

The *Deeksharambh* Student Orientation Programme for the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Year UG students of Amity School of Fine Arts was successfully held on 14<sup>th</sup> July 2025 in Room K1-402.

The session commenced with a warm welcome and an insightful address by Prof. (Dr.) Pradeep Joshi, Group Addl. Pro Vice-Chancellor and Dean of Applied Arts/Fine Arts/Performing Arts/Visual Arts. He briefed about what all sessions will be conducted during orientation. Prof. (Dr.) Pradeep Joshi, Group Addl. The next session was about NTCC (Non-Teaching Credit Course) in which the internal and external components were discussed. Dr. Varun Sahai the coordinator for NTCC told the minimum passing marks and how the credits impact the SGPA.

For the 3<sup>rd</sup> year student's portfolio is very important for the industry internship course in NTCC. The importance of Resume and Portfolio was told to the students.

The next session was the industry session. The first speaker was Prof. Usha Iyer, Academic Head ISDC. She talked about the changes in industries and how the students will have to prepared. She also talked about the originality required in work. Keeping work simple. Prof. Usha talked about the importance of communication. Communication should be clear. Working upon the communication skills is important.
